## **Holiday Recycling YES & NO**

#### "YES" Items for your Recycle Cart:

- non-metallic wrapping paper and gift bags (handles removed)
- tissue paper
- cardboard
- gift boxes and shoe boxes
- aluminum foil and food trays (rinsed to remove food)
- greeting cards, envelopes, gift cards, tags
- old calendars (remove metal or plastic coils; staples are OK)

#### "NO" Items for your Recycle Cart:

- foil or metal-looking wrapping paper or gift bags
- ribbons, bows, beads, string, garland, or tinsel
- holiday decorations (lights, bells, ornaments, etc.)
- bubble wrap
- plastics toys
- batteries, electronics, or Christmas trees

## **Christmas Tree Disposal**

If you still haven't disposed of your Christmas tree, it WILL NOT be picked up with regular trash. Free drop-off locations for cut real Christmas trees are available until Jan 16 at the Allen County Highway Dept - 2234 Carroll Road, the Biosolids Handling Facility - 6202 Lake Avenue, and the New Haven Utility Shop - 2201 Summit Street, New Haven. Call ACDEM 449-7878 with questions.

Simply take your live tree to one of the drop-off sites and leave it in the designated area.

Ornaments, tinsel, lights, stands, and plastic bags must be removed from the tree before it is dropped off. Artificial trees, wreaths and garland are not accepted.

Wreaths may be placed in your garbage cart.

## **I&M Announces Scams are Up**

Indiana Michigan (I&M) has announced that Scam calls regarding their service are on the rise. I&M will never call you to demand immediate payment, and they do NOT disconnect without any prior warning. Scammers can spoof telephone numbers to look legitimate and will often ask for prepaid debit cards or account information. If you get a call that seems suspicious, hang up and contact them: 800-311-4634.

#### HANG UP if the caller demands:

- Immediate payment
- Bank or credit card info
- A Prepaid card, wire transfer, or gift card

As I'm sure you're all aware, the 2020 Annual Association meeting was cancelled due to Covid, and it looks like the 2021 Annual Association meeting will also not be held due to the pandemic. Should that change, notification will be sent out.

However, the LPIA Board of Directors continues to work on behalf of the residents in Lafayette Place. Monthly Board meetings are being conducted via Zoom for the safety of our Board members.

No Annual meeting in 2020 meant no election of new Board members for a 2-year term. Fortunately, the 4 Board members whose terms would have expired all agreed to extend their terms to 2022. Those members were Anne Gregory, Amy Grubbs, Kevin Rarey, and Michelle Wood.

In 2021, there will be 3 open positions on the Board, but again we do not foresee an open Annual meeting in April of 2021 due to the pandemic. # **Lafayette Place 2021 Recycling Schedule**

We are on "A" schedule for recycling and our recycle items are picked up in the yellow topped can every other Thursday, with your garbage.

Your garbage & recycle bins must be 3 feet apart & at the curb by 6am for the truck to pick up!

For your convenience, our 2021 recycle dates are listed below.

January 14 & 28 February 11 & 25 March: 11 & 25 April: 8 & 22 May: 6 & 20 June: 3 & 17 July: 1. 15 & 29 August: 12 & 26

September:10 & 23 \*\* see below

October: 7 & 21 November: 4 & 18 December: 2, 16 & 30

\*\* Some dates listed are on a Friday instead of Thursday as Garbage & Recycle Service will be one day behind following a National holiday.
