So Much Happening!

It's been a while since the last Newsletter (my apology – health & personal issues competed for my time) so there's a LOT to tell you.

The first thing to share is that Lafayette Place has been chosen as the featured neighborhood for this year's ARCH Home & Garden Tour! We are SO excited about this honor. In case you don't know, ARCH is Fort Wayne's historic preservation organization and is well known for its annual Home & Garden Tours. ARCH anticipates we will have between 500 & 800 people for this tour.

Additionally, there will be food trucks selling delicious food & drinks. We are also working to bring various artists to display & sell their wares in the Esplanade. ARCH will also have a "Silent Auction" in their tent set up in the Esplanade. These activities will be located in the Gazebo area of the Esplanade.

ARCH will handle all the publicity, media, and ticket sales.

LPIA has procured \$3,700 in sponsorships! Our share of the expenses comes to \$2,200, which means we'll have a profit of \$1,700 BEFORE any ticket sales! All profits from ticket sales will be shared equally between ARCH and LPIA.

This will be a GREAT event and a wonderful opportunity to promote Lafayette Place. So it is REALLY IMPORTANT that ALL our properties look their best! PLEASE make sure your grass is cut, weeds are pulled, and no debris or trash is visible.

This is also the perfect incentive for any "sprucing up" that needs to be done - i.e. paint touch ups, gutter cleaning or repair or any thing else to make your property as attractive as possible.

As previously stated, we are expecting between 500 & 800 visitors strolling through our neighborhood for this one-day event. Let's make sure Lafayette Place is seen as one of the best and most beautiful neighborhoods in Fort Wayne!

Do You Want A Tree?

Age and disease has eliminated many trees in medians throughout our neighborhood. Fort Wayne Parks & Recreation has a program to purchase trees to be placed in the median in front of a home.

There are specific criteria for planting and the type of tree that is acceptable, and an application form must be completed online by July 1. The cost is \$50.00 per tree and the Parks Department will plant them if we order as an Association.

Lafayette Place resident Cheryl McCarthy has volunteered to be the contact person/organizer for this project. So, if you want a tree planted in front of your home, call Cheryl McCarthy no later than Friday, June 23 at 458-9265.

One application and order with all locations will then be turned in. Checks for your tree should be made payable to LPIA and we will then pay with one check to cover all orders. No order will be placed without payment.

The trees will be planted between October 1 and December 31, 2017. If you have any questions, call Cheryl at 458-9265.
